1. Background

In the last four years, the Government of Ethiopia has initiated various reform programs that have implications for improving the ease of doing business. One important pillar is the introduction of policies and legal frameworks governing the digital economy. Ethiopia's move to the digital economy is accompanied by the promulgation of Digital Ethiopia strategy, Electronic Transaction Proclamation, Personal Data Protection Proclamation as well as National Digital ID Proclamation. National ID (NID) is the foundation on which all digital services and transactions can occur in a trusted framework. NID is led by a program that is currently within the Office of the Prime Minister.

The NID Program is working to enroll and provide digital Identification to all residents in Ethiopia with the goal of providing advanced financial, social, public, and other services that identify a physical person using foundational individualizing mechanisms rather than functional ones. NIDP intends to issue Digital IDs to over 70million citizens and residents in Ethiopia by the end of 2025. Currently, field trials are underway as part of the pilot targeting to enroll 100,000 residents by end of, June 2022 from selected use cases such as the Industrial Park Development Corporation (IPDC), Banking sector and Productive Safety Net Program (PSNP). Pilot enrollment has already commenced at IPDC-Bole Lemi Industrial Park and with the Head Quarter staff registration at several government-owned and private banks totaling 30,000 registrations.

The PSNP program has two major schemes: the rural (rPSNP) and urban (uPSNP) programs targeting the rural community and urban dwellers respectively. The rPSNP program under the Ministry of Agriculture (MoA) targets tackling food insecurity, among others, by means of direct cash transfer and payment for [labor intensive] public work. The partnership with NIDP in this pilot enrollment envisages registering more than 44,000 rPSNP beneficiaries (including their spouses) in seven selected Woredas from Oromia, SNNPR, and Sidama regions.

In some areas where there is a working banking system nearby, deposits are made to bank accounts of the beneficiaries, whereas most of the payments are made in the form of cash transfer. This system of direct economic support however has its own flaws including, but not limited to; ghost beneficiaries continued payments to deceased beneficiaries, fraud, etc. To prevent such misappropriation of payments and fraud through these and other untraced leaks, the rPSNP program has intended to filter the list of beneficiaries and personalize and monitor the beneficiary [payment] card system. One critical element in this regard is the precise identification of the intended beneficiaries, and the highly sought-after partnership with the NIDP is expected to sufficiently bridge this gap.

NIDP strives to provide a foundational trusted framework where uniquely identifying a person is made possible by the use of demographic and biometric data. A simplistic approach in collecting demographic data (i.e., Name, Gender, Age, and Current

Address) is deployed along with capturing biometric attributes (i.e., 4-4-2 fingerprint, IRIS scan, and face photo) to issue a digital ID with a unique set of 12-digit FAYDA Identification Number (FIN). This digital ID could then be used to authenticate the person across any service sector where a system-to-system integration is realized. It is believed that the implementation of the pilot enrollment at these selected rPSNP Woredas will render the initial and yet important piece to realize the digital identification of beneficiaries of the project.

For the rollout of this pilot registration, which is scheduled to kick-start in the second week of May 2022, NIDP is undertaking the necessary planning and preparation work in collaboration with MoA, regional and local/Woreda administrations, and other stakeholders. Consultations are also being made to facilitate the appropriate provisions required for the effective rollout. For practical reasons and logistical purposes, the registration will focus on a specific Woreda of a region initially and will progress systematically to cover all Woredas of the region. Similar mechanisms will be adopted in all three regions which allow learning from initial implementations so that follow-up enrollments could be improved.

The rPSNP registration is critically important as it will be the first deployment in a rural setup where valuable experience will be obtained to customize the incoming national rollout as most of the expected 70 million registrants are residing in the rural part of Ethiopia. Hence, due emphasis and collaboration are required in the facilitation and provision of required assistance including funding the mission to make the pilot rPSNP enrollment a success.

Moreover, an Exit Survey is designed to take place at the enrollment sites which will help to evaluate the enrollment implementation and suggest improvements to better customize the national rollout.

2. Objectives of the Training of DA s for the pilot rPSNP-enrollment

- The primary objective of the training is to implement the pilot enrollment of the rPSNP beneficiaries at the selected seven Woredas in the three regions to NIDP's digital ID platform.

- Assist in filtering the list of actual rPSNP beneficiaries through the means of unique identification
- Complete the important building block for a digital identification through authentication
- Assist in regulating the rPSNP beneficiary cash transfer through enabling reliable and robust beneficiary identification
- Increase the registration count for NIDP pilot program

3. Involved Stakeholders and Composition of Participants of the rPSNP DA Training

3.1. Participants of the Training

A total of 406 participants attended the training conducted for the DAs in the 7 woredas of Oromiya, Sidama and SNNP, where 21 % were female and the rest 79 % were male .

Out of the total 192 participants from three woredas of Oromiya region (Dodota, Adami Tulu & Adama) 22% were female and the rest 78% male. Out of the total 98 participants from two woredas of Sidama region (Dale, Boricha,) 16% were female and the rest 84 % male. Out of the total 116 participants from two woredas of SNNP region(Hulbareg, Damot Sore) who attended the training, 23% were female and the rest 77% were male. Please refer Annex III for the detail.

3.2. Stakeholders

The main stakeholders in this partnership include: NIDP, MoA-PSNP, Regional and local administrations in Oromia, SNNPR, and Sidama regions. CBE is a major financial institution where all rPSNP payments are hosted/transacted, and it is an important stakeholder in this partnership. Collaboration in the system-to-system integration between NID and CBE is vitally important to provide a full-fledged eKYC service to the rPSNP beneficiaries and realize the complete outcome of a trusted digital identification platform.

ID4D: as a major NIDP partner, ID4D is also an important stakeholder in providing technical assistance to NIDP operations but also financing the Exit Survey

4. Discussion:

The main areas of discussion and focus of presentations during the training includes the following areas: Introduction to the NIDP program, the objectives and scope of the pilot enrollment in the rPSNP, the basics and components of the enrollment process, the use and filling of the Consent Form. The following concepts were also described on detail:

- **Vision and Core Principles of Digital ID Ethiopia**

Vision: “To Build a Sustainable Digital ID supporting all use cases for all Citizens and Residents by 2025”

Principles in terms of Inclusiveness, Design and Governance.

- **What is Digital ID?**

Digital identity, or digital ID (eID), is the proof of identity which offers nations a unique opportunity to accelerate the pace of their national progress. It changes the way services are delivered, and helps grow a country’s digital economy.

- **ID Issuance Process Flow:** Registration → Validation → ID Number Generation → Notification via SMS/Email → Printing → Authentication/ eKYC.

- **Datasets for Registration:**

- Demographic Data: Name, Age/ DoB, Gender...
- Evidence Documents: Proof of Consent, Proof of Address...
- Biometric Data: Iris, Fingerprint, Photo.

- **Digital ID Milestones and Digital ID Functional Architecture**

- **Objectives of the PSNP:** Support No/Low Income members of the community (the poorest of the poor) known as beneficiaries, categorized as Urban PSNP(uPSNP) and Rural PSNP(rPSNP).

- **PSNP Pilot Objectives:** Registering “All” Beneficiaries & their spouses in the selected woredas and Verifying Uniqueness and issuing Fayda IDs to each beneficiary.

5. Major Achievements of the workshop

The major outcome of this pilot enrollment includes

- The registration of more than 44,000 rPSNP beneficiaries in the Permanent Direct Support (PDS) and Public Work (PW) schemes of the seven selected Woredas in Oromia, SNNPR, and Sidama regions to the NIDP's digital ID platform
- Issuing unique FAYDA number to registrants that can be used for authentication in future payments of the rPSNP program
- Pave way for the system-to-system integration of rPSNP payment database through the CBE
- Provide up-to-date and reliable list of rPSNP beneficiaries in these Woredas thereby preventing misappropriation of financial support resulting from fraud and,
- Building a continuing partnership between NID and PSNP program to scale-up the pilot registration to cover beneficiaries in all regions and city administrations to also include other schemes such as uPSNP.
